


# **OUR MODEL**


LOYAC is a regional non-profit organization with an operating model of three interconnected core program areas, which serves as the bridge from strategy to impact and results.

Moreover, through the programs offered within the scope of professional development, LOYAC aims at tackling the issues of unemployment, diversifyingwork fields and ultimately raising the youth's level of productivity.

# EMPOWERING CHILDREN.. THE FOUNDATION OF HUMAN CAPITAL DEVELOPMENT



#### **2019 BLOOD DRIVE INITIATIVE**

Sponsored by the Ahli Bank of Kuwait and in collaboration with Central Blood Bank of Kuwait and TriStar Motorcycle Company, LOYAC launched its 2019 Blood Drive on February 2nd at the Boulevard Mall marking its 8th year of the annual campaign.

This year, the campaign was held under the theme of "Be a Reason for Saving Lives", because we believe that donors are the key to saving lives. Through our annual blood drives, we aim to spread awareness about the importance of community participation for a sufficient and sustainable blood supply and its vital impact in saving lives especially when hospitals face shortage in blood units. We also aim at shedding the light on the role that voluntary donation systems play in encouraging people to care for one another and enhance community cohesion.

# INTERNATIONAL DAY OF PEOPLE WITH DISABILITIES EVENT

International Day of People with Disability is held each year on the 3rd of December, and is celebrated internationally in an aim to increase public awareness, acceptance and understanding of people with disability within their communities. In 2019, LOYAC celebrated this special day at the United Nations with a theme focused on "Overcoming Barriers Towards Sustainable Development". Through this event, group discussions were held which focused on youth's abilities rather than limitations in three areas: inclusion, empowerment and resources needed to overcome challenges.


This occurrence came in support of Kuwait's National Development Plan, which highlights the importance of implementing Kuwait's "2035 Vision" for people with disability and special needs to help integrate them into the society as both beneficiaries and agents of change.

This initiative, which came in collaboration with the UNDP, Supreme Council for Planning and Development (SCPD) and the Public Authority for the Disabled (PADA), aimed towards contributing to an inclusive, equitable and sustainable development strategy under the pledge of "Leave No One Behind", including those with disabilities.

#### INTERNATIONAL VOLUNTEER DAY

On December 5th, and in celebration of International Volunteer Day, LOYAC held a ceremony at Al-Shaheed Park to honor its distinguished volunteers as well as the various civic organizations who were dedicated to serving the community throughout 2019. On the sideline of the event, an exhibition was held featuring civic organizations and community service centers interested in volunteerism, like Al-Kharafi Activity Kids Center, Abeer 2, Kuwait Down Syndrome Society, etc.

The aim of this event was to draw attention to the importance of volunteer work and its role in increasing social inclusion which in turn helps build social sustainability within our communities.

# REGIONAL HUMANITARIAN INITIATIVES

Too often women and children are denied their right to educational or training opportunities due to their financial abilities, identities or conservative backgrounds. LOYAC has been working for the past few years in communities across the Arab region to transform classrooms into inclusive spaces that allow women and children access to quality educational and vocational opportunities. Below is an overview of our humanitarian work in 2019 in both Lebanon and Yemen.

### **YEMEN**

In 2016, LOYAC Yemen launched Give Her a Chance Project to educate, train and empower Yemeni women in Aden, Lahij, and Hadramaut. Through this project, women are offered literacy classes that follow the curriculum of Yemen's Ministry of Education in teaching Arabic, English, and Math. Moreover, the project includes the Training Center where women learn different skills like sewing, makeup artistry, perfume making, etc. in an aim to empower them economically and give them the financial independence needed to support themselves and their families. Giver Her a Chance Project has recently launched the Tailoring Center in Lahij to provide Yemeni women with employment opportunities as artisans, where they work on making handmade and embroidered clothes, bags and accessories. In addition to this project, LOYAC Yemen initiated 11 humanitarian activities in 2019, some of which were food aids, awareness campaigns, public libraries, kids' camps, etc.

#### **LEBANON**

MobArt, which was launched in 2017, aims at serving a small community made up of 65 refugee families based at the Faour Camp in the Bekaa valley of Lebanon. Through this initiative, children are engaged in different education and arts programs facilitated by experienced teachers, and women are empowered to have a craft of their own through which they can sustain themselves in the future.

Over the past three years, MobArt Camp programs and staff brought together 800 young adult volunteers from different nationalities and countries to deliver and facilitate various activities, which benefited a total of 80 women and 200 children. By bridging the gap between refugees and host communities, we create a more enlightened community for peace and prosperity.



LOYAC AC Milan Soccer School, which was established in 2009, is one of the leading soccer schools in the region and a pioneer in technical and tactical football training offering youth of ages 5 years and above the opportunity to hone their soccer skills and fitness through highly functional and quality designed training.



#### **ALSHAHEED PARK**

Since 2014, LOYAC was entrusted by Kuwait's Amiri Diwan to manage Al-Shaheed Park, which is the largest urban park in the country.

LOYAC manages the overall property and its facilities, from overseeing the park's maintenance and cleanliness to ensuring the safety and security of visitors. LOYAC also contributes to the park management process in cultivating and nurturing the history, culture and arts in the country through a year-long set of events and activities while creating a platform that engages the community.



### LOYAC ACADEMY OF PERFORMING ARTS (LAPA)

LOYAC officially established its Academy of Performing Arts in 2010, in an aim towards encouraging local talent and spreading culture, art and awareness through a variety of workshops and events in drama, music, arts, singing and dancing tailored to young children and adults.
