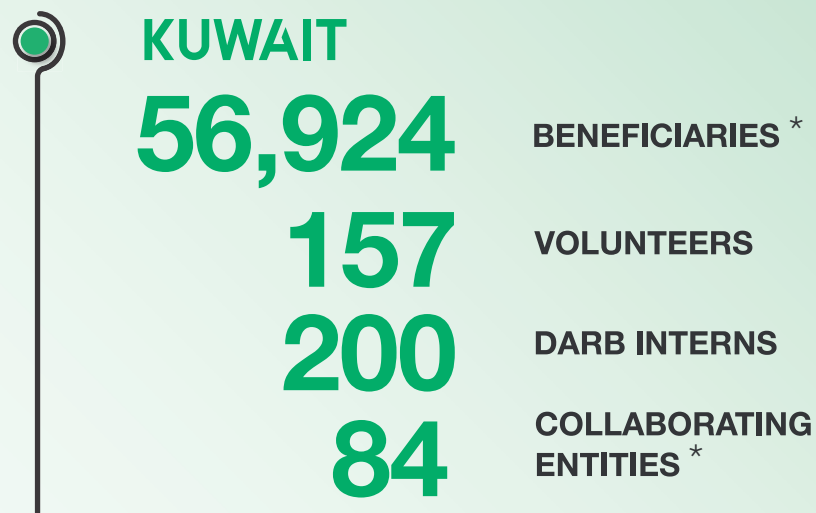

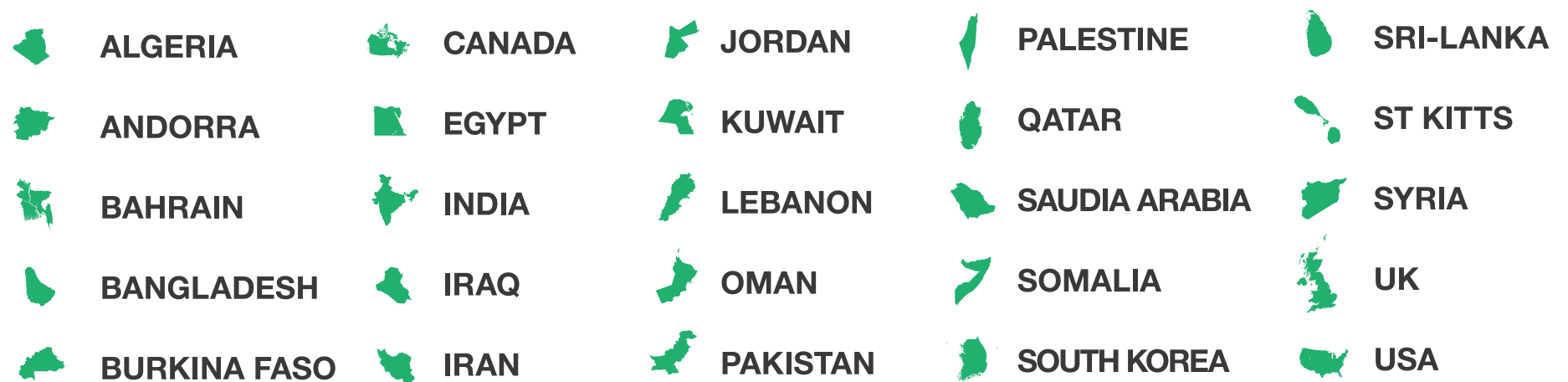

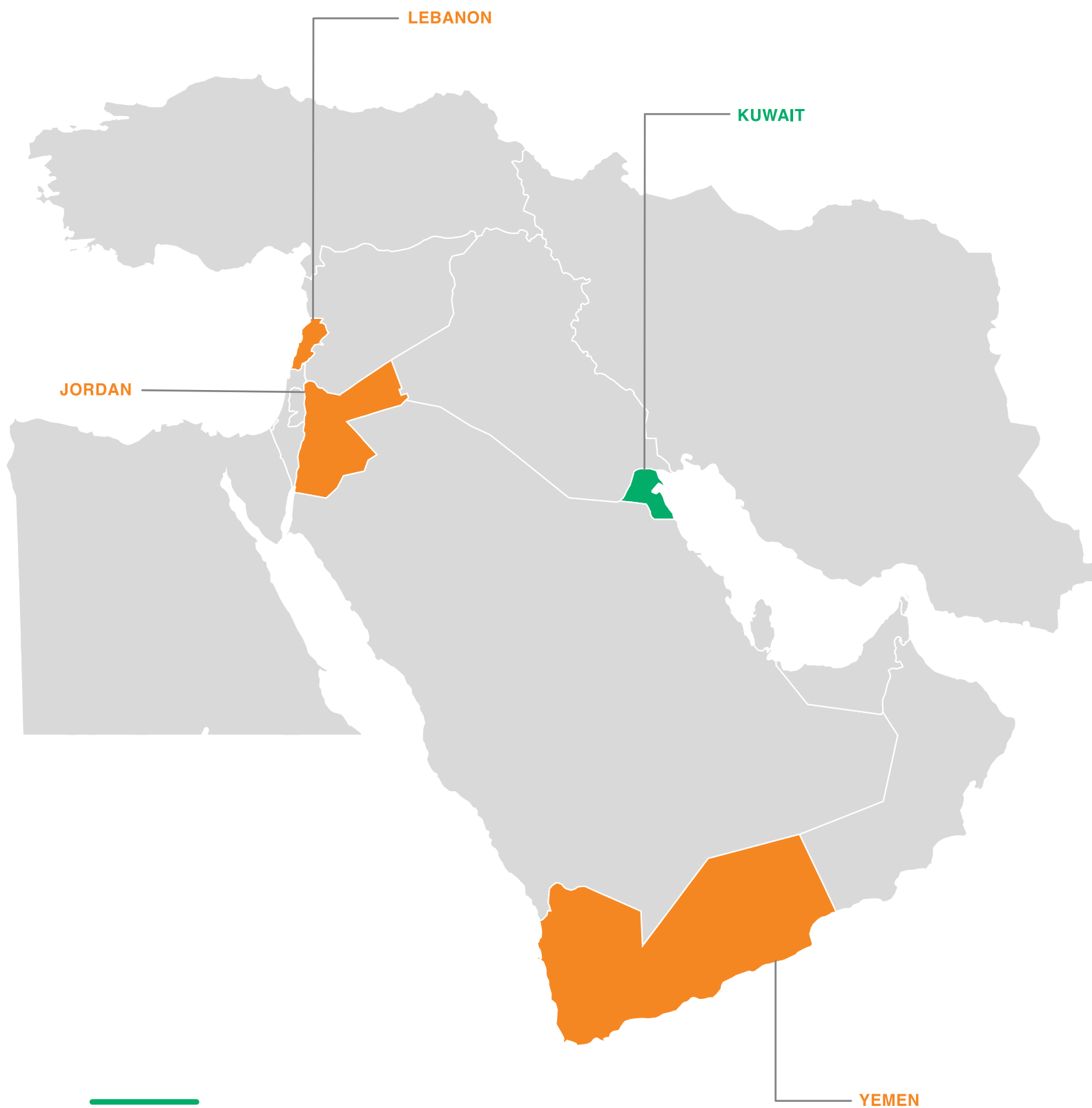

2020 LOYAC PROGRAMS BY AGE GROUP

Faced with the halt of in-person programs due to the spread of COVID-19 pandemic, LOYAC had to pivot from its set plans, develop new strategies and implement adaptive models, including virtual learning to continue delivering our programs. In April of 2020, our main programs went through a digital transition and many new virtual workshops were introduced providing an essential gateway for youth development on a local and regional level.

PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT

BOUNDLESS POTENTIAL IN WAKE OF THE PANDEMIC

We believe societies become stronger when its youth are given the opportunity to develop and contribute. Through LOYAC's professional development programs, we strive to empower and unlock the potential of young students and graduates, thus making it possible for them to flourish on an interpersonal and career level.

This year, with the global spread of COVID-19 disrupting companies' operations, forcing thousands to work remotely online, and shaking up the in-person internship model, LOYAC had to quickly give its internship structure an intense virtual makeover. LOYAC's Internship Program (Darb) and Bridge Workshops were offered online with an aim of continuing to help youth develop transferable career skills, apply their academic knowledge to real-life situations, develop professional networks, and facilitate their socialization and entry into the workforce. Remote internship opportunities were offered in the fields of Digital Marketing, Web and Graphic Design, Business Administration, Customer Service, etc.

Conscious of the importance of the industrial sector in improving employment opportunities for youth and in creating a sustainable diversified economy, which comes within the seven pillars of Kuwait's National Development Plan, LOYAC offered the online AISenaa Fares Almostaqbal Workshop during the pandemic in collaboration with Kuwait Industries Union.

To further mitigate the effects of crisis on the long term, LOYAC launched a series of online professional training workshops to equip youth with skills needed to benefit from new employment opportunities in the post-COVID world, like the online Essential Professional Competencies Skills Workshops.

While staff at LOYAC are eager to resume in-person professional training, they are also excited about continuing to leverage technology to enhance initiatives and make them more accessible and inclusive.

COMMUNITY SERVICE

RISING TO THE CHALLENGE THROUGH VOLUNTEERING

LOYAC believes that volunteerism is an asset for youth empowerment, as a people-centered approach to achieving sustainable development and peace. It has the capacity to transform volunteers into active agents of change through community engagement and action, skills and knowledge exchange, and diverse social networking.

At the heart of the COVID-19 pandemic this year, and in face of curfews, lockdowns and new health and safety measures, in-person volunteer opportunities became significantly limited. With an unwavering commitment to fulfill its mission despite the pandemic restrictions, LOYAC opted to offer its youth volunteers unprecedented opportunities to give back to the community.

Aware of the impact of collaborations with different governmental, private and civic entities have on building strong and inclusive communities, LOYAC was keen on working with several parties during the pandemic to implement its volunteer initiatives. In collaboration with the General Department of Civil Defense in Kuwait, LOYAC launched its «Volunteering for the Safety of My Country» campaign, which included supporting front-line health care workers at different hospitals, preparing COVID-19 nasal swabs and sanitizing public facilities.

Furthermore, the introduction of online learning in lieu of on-site programs provided LOYAC with a gateway to offer remote volunteer opportunities. Trainers volunteered their time to conduct several of LOYAC's programs and workshops, like Little Loyacers and MobArt. In addition, volunteers took part in food distribution initiatives to the disadvantaged families in the community affected by the pandemic.

LOYAC volunteers in Kuwait and the region have showcased an exceptional display of hope and solidarity in response to the needs of their local communities amidst the pandemic. This shared sense of responsibility has instilled the spirit and desire for global togetherness in time of crisis.

EXPERIENTIAL LEARNING

CULTIVATING FUTURE LEADERS

Impactful leaders have the vision, energy and courage to drive positive change across countries and communities, if equipped with the necessary skills and provided with opportunities and support. As an organization committed to hands-on experiential learning, LOYAC offers youth prominent opportunities to step beyond the boundaries of a traditional classroom to analyze and confront critical issues shaping societies worldwide.

The onset of COVID-19 pandemic and the halt of on-site programs did not derail LOYAC's efforts in providing youth communities with immersive experiences that would enhance their leadership, creativity, resilience and action-orientation skills. Programs within the Experiential Learning core area were transitioned onto the virtual platform, Zoom, and new workshops in this field were offered as well, like the Innovation Camp, which was held in collaboration with Injaz.

Furthermore, pivoting to remote delivery of programs and workshops enabled our organization to continue its efforts in community building and providing emerging leaders the opportunity to network with local and international experts and stakeholders. Additionally, virtual programming provided a vital outlet for exchange of experiences between youth participants, which helped in deepening their intercultural leadership and competency in times of crisis.

EMPOWERING YOUTH IN TIMES OF CRISIS

Because early education and skills enhancement can have a big impact on life-long behaviors, LOYAC continued its mission in children's enrichment and

empowerment as one of its focal areas of attention during the pandemic by delivering the Little Loyacers Program in its virtual version. The program worked on developing the children's comprehensive capabilities as well as enhancing their belief that the impact they can have on planet Earth is crucial.

CONFRONTING GLOBAL CHALLENGES

LOYAC believes in the capability of young leaders to not only prosper as social entrepreneurs but to also bring about positive and significant social impact, which in turn contributes to achieving the United Nations Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs). Despite the interruptions caused by the pandemic this year, LOYAC was determined to continue fulfilling its mission in helping youth unlock their potential and develop innovative business ideas. Thus, LOYAC virtually transformed its Kon Social Entrepreneurship Program, which comes in collaboration with Babson College. The program introduced youth to Babson's innovative Entrepreneurial Thought & Action® (ET&A™) model, which helped them transform their ideas into reality.

LOCAL EVENTS

2020 BLOOD DRIVE

Sponsored by the Ahli Bank of Kuwait and in collaboration with Central Blood Bank of Kuwait and TriStar Motorcycle Company, LOYAC launched its 2020 Blood Drive on January 10th at Souq Sharq marking its 9th year of the annual campaign. This year, the campaign – entitled “Your Blood... Their Hope” – was held in support of children with cancer with an aim to enhance community solidarity and cohesion and to raise awareness on the importance of community participation and its vital impact in alleviating the suffering of young patients and in saving their lives. Different activities took place during the event to enhance the participation of blood donors, including TriStar biker's convoy, an arts performance by LOYAC Academy for Performing Arts (LAPA), children's face painting and games, in addition to providing food and drink stalls.



RAMADAN GHABQA

LOYAC held its first of a kind a virtual Ramadan Ghabqa on Zoom platform on the 8th of May, 2020 with the attendance of staff, volunteers and alumni from LOYAC Kuwait and its Chapters in Jordan and Lebanon, as well as from its affiliates, LOYAC Academy for Performing Arts (LAPA), Al-Shaheed Park, and AC Milan Soccer Academy. The event featured a variety of traditional and entertaining activities, including competitions, discussions, sharing of volunteer experiences during pandemic, gift draws, etc., in an aim to engage employees, volunteers and alumni and enhance the relationships between them to embody a spirit of the family during the Holy month.

“ALL FOR KUWAIT” CAMPAIGN

LOYAC launched the online «All For Kuwait» Campaign to express its sincere appreciation and gratitude to staff and volunteers from different sectors, including the Ministry of Health, Ministry of Defense, Cooperative Societies, etc. who worked tirelessly at the frontline in combating the pandemic to secure the safety of the country and its citizens, and to provide support and service during crisis. As part of this campaign, posts of staff and volunteer citizens and residents working together in service of the country during the pandemic were featured on LOYAC's social media accounts.



“PLEDGE FOR HUMANITY” CAMPAIGN

As the world entered a critical phase with the spread of the coronavirus, LOYAC rose to the challenge to rally its local and regional communities to action and renew their resolve to do their part by launching the online «Pledge for Humanity» Campaign. Participants from the staff, volunteers and the public in Kuwait, Jordan and Lebanon took an oath upon themselves to help in raising awareness and taking corrective measures to slow down the spread of the pandemic and minimize its harmful impact on people in their own communities. Approximately 500 participants signed their acknowledgment to comply with the directives dictated in the pledge.

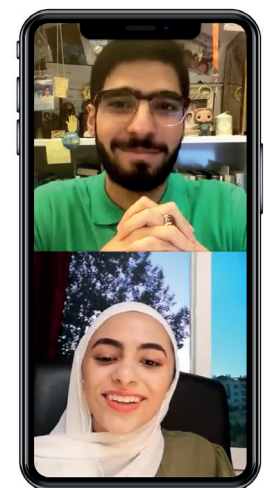
MASK CHALLENGE

To boost the COVID-19 prevention awareness and curb its spread, LOYAC held an online homemade cloth facemask-making contest. The contest was open for participants from Kuwait and the region. Contestants were encouraged to abide by the instructions provided by the Ministry of Health and World Health Organization when sewing the cloth facemask to ensure it is up to health and safety standards. Contestants shared photos of their handmade masks on their social media accounts and we in turn shared them on LOYAC's Instagram account. This initiative inspired many to use their creativity in making their own facemasks at home.



LOYAC ARABIA

Amidst the pandemic, LOYAC launched the new media program entitled «LOYAC Arabia», which brings together youth participants and alumni from Kuwait, Jordan & Lebanon. This comes as part of the organization's series of online programs and live sessions launched online in a move aimed at motivating youth to adjust to a norm that lacks in-person social interaction. Through this unique regional program which was broadcasted live on Instagram, LOYAC aimed at shedding the light on the achievements of its chapters in addition to offering youth volunteers and interns from different countries the opportunity to exchange experiences and lessons learnt over the course of the pandemic.



TALK OF MEMORIES

In order to get youth out of the prevailing atmosphere of anxiety due to the spread of the Corona virus, and to encourage the exchange of their experiences amongst the public, LOYAC launched the “Talk of Memories” program via Instagram Live. The episodes were presented by LOYAC's Executive Board Member, Ms. Fetouh Al Dalali, who hosted guest speakers from LOYAC's alumni members whom were working in the front lines in face of the pandemic. The alumni guests spoke about the challenges they faced during the crisis, and shared their past experiences and memories while participating in LOYAC's programs.

INTERNATIONAL VOLUNTEER DAY

In celebration of International Volunteer Day, LOYAC hosted a virtual regional event entitled “Together, We Create Change” for its volunteers from Kuwait Jordan and Lebanon. During the event, volunteers shared experiences and challenges they faced during the pandemic and discussed how to make use of technology as a positive step towards evolution and change in times of crisis. The event also featured a variety of activities, including competitions, a talent show and group discussions about achievements made in community service during this exceptional year.



REGIONAL HUMANITARIAN INITIATIVES

Since 2002, LOYAC has been known for its resilience during challenging times and its ability to adapt to changing and challenging situations. Throughout this exceptional year and in face of a global crisis our mission has never been more relevant and important. LOYAC continued to carry out its humanitarian efforts with the support of the local and regional communities, thus emerging stronger and more resilient through this difficult time. Below is an overview of our humanitarian work in 2020 in Kuwait, Lebanon and Yemen.

KUWAIT

With the outbreak of Coronavirus and school closures, the quality of the home learning environment became even more crucial. In response to this situation, LOYAC's Academy of Performing Arts (LAPA) launched its MobArt Program for youth of disadvantaged families in Kuwait with an aim to minimize disruptions caused by the pandemic to the student learning process. The program provided youth of ages 6 to 13 years with electronic devices and connectivity to access online interactive educational and entertaining resources and services, including workshops and activities in the fields of handicrafts, drama and performing arts, music, English language and interactive storytelling. Workshops were offered by specialized professional trainers who volunteered their time to help the young children overcome anxiety.

MobArt was originally launched in Lebanon in 2017 with an aim of empowering and equipping women and children of 65 refugee families residing at the Faour Camp in the Bekaa valley of Lebanon with a craft of their own through which they can sustain themselves in the future. LOYAC continues to run the program in Lebanon as it believes that by bridging the gap between refugees and host communities, we create a more enlightened community for peace and prosperity.

LEBANON

In response to the call of humanity following the tragic explosion at Beirut Port, LOYAC Lebanon in cooperation and support of LOYAC Kuwait launched «Rise Up Beirut» Campaign to provide urgent and immediate aid to the victims. This initiative came under the umbrella of «Homes» emergency program, through which three groups of volunteers were formulated to receive and find quick solutions for cases, to help in repairing affected houses and to help clean and remove damaged structures.

Through the campaign, 150 homes and an orphanage center that houses 220 children were rehabilitated. The campaign's activity expanded beyond the rehabilitation of buildings to the distribution of food supplies, clothes and medicine to affected community, which included over 400 families.

In parallel with providing materialistic support to affected families, LOYAC's Academy for Performing Arts (LAPA) provided moral and psychological support to the children and youth by offering them a variety of programs and activities in the fields of theatre, as well as performing and plastic arts. This helped give the youth and children a safe and artistic space to express their pain and anger in face of this tragic event.

LOYAC has set a comprehensive and diversified plan to continue running the campaign in year 2021 and 2022 that will benefit a large number of families in Beirut's community affected by the explosion.

YEMEN

Due to its significant impact in educating, training and empowering Yemeni women, LOYAC continued to offer "Give Her a Chance Program" in Aden, Lahij, and Hadramaut. Through the program, women were offered literacy classes that align with Yemen's Ministry of Education curriculum for teaching Arabic, English, and Math. Moreover, women in Lahij were provided with artisan employment opportunities through the program's Tailoring Center, where they work on making handmade and embroidered clothes, bags and accessories.

Furthermore, LOYAC Yemen initiated "I Will Be Fine Program", which provided educational classes, psychological support and recovery of 210 children from war trauma. Other humanitarian activities in 2020 included distribution of food and clothes during Ramadan and Eid.

LOYAC AFFILIATES

LOYAC AC MILAN SOCCER SCHOOL

LOYAC AC Milan Soccer School, which was established in 2009, is one of the leading soccer schools in the region and a pioneer in technical and tactical football training offering youth of ages 5 years and above the opportunity to hone their soccer skills and fitness through highly functional and quality designed training. Over the course of 11 years, LOYAC AC Milan Soccer Academy trained more than 1,500 players. In 2020, 481 trainees took part in the activities before they were suspended due to the spread of the Corona virus.



ALSHAHEED PARK

Since 2014, LOYAC was entrusted by Kuwait's Amiri Diwan to manage Al-Shaheed Park, which is the largest urban park in the country.

LOYAC manages the overall property and its facilities, from overseeing the park's maintenance and cleanliness to ensuring the safety and security of visitors. LOYAC also contributes to the park management process in cultivating and nurturing the history, culture and arts in the country through a year-long set of events and activities while creating a platform that engages the community.
